

Honors in Psychology

University Honors Program students in good standing who are Psychology majors are eligible (and strongly encouraged) to earn Departmental Honors in Psychology at graduation.

Requirements are:

- 3.5 or higher GPA in all Psychology courses
- Complete a senior thesis with a Psychology faculty member
 - Students register for Honors thesis hours, course number IDS 395.03; (at least 3 hours are required to meet Honors Program participation requirements)
 - Students must have worked previously in same faculty member's research lab
- Present a senior thesis project at the Psychology Honors Colloquium

All students who complete the above requirements and apply to the Honors Program for departmental honors at graduation will have Department of Psychology Honors printed on their ISU diploma.

Students wishing to earn Psychology Honors must declare their intent with the University's Honors Program office at the beginning of the semester in which they plan to graduate.

Students who have registered for thesis hours will receive in the mail the Honors Colloquium Registration Form or the form can be downloaded. Completed forms should be returned to the Department during the month of March of the spring semester in which the senior thesis project will be presented.

Psychology Honors students are also eligible to enroll in Honors sections of the following courses:
