

SCHOOL OF THEATRE HONORS PROGRAM

The School of Theatre offers to qualified students an honors program intended to enrich, extend, and reward their academic accomplishments.

Theatre majors with superior academic records are invited to apply for admission to the School's honor program in Theatre Studies. Students successfully completing the honors program will receive the designation of honors in Theatre Studies upon graduation. The student's official academic transcript and diploma will be so noted.

Admission Requirements: The candidate must . . .

- 1) Be a declared Theatre major with at least 60, and not more than 90, hours of course work completed;
- 2) Have a minimum 3.3 overall university grade point average;
- 3) Have a minimum 3.5 overall School of Theatre average;
- 4) Submit a letter of recommendation from a faculty member in the school;
- 5) Have demonstrated evidence of leadership by participating in student organizations, productions or have received recognition for written work;
- 6) Submit a letter of application to the School of Theatre's honors advisor.

School of Theatre Honors Program Requirements: Students admitted into the Theatre Department honors program will be required to . . .

- 1) Successfully complete six hours of Honors Independent Study (projects could be scholarly or creative);
- 2) Initiate and complete a research project or honors portfolio under the direction of a faculty member;
- 3) Maintain a 3.3 University grade point average;
- 4) Maintain a 3.5 School of Theatre grade point average;
- 5) Receive no grade less than B in any School of Theatre class while in the program; and
- 6) Fulfill the general requirements for participation in the University Honor Program.

Once admitted to the School of Theatre Honors program, the honors candidate will be advised by the School of Theatre Honors advisor, who must approve the candidate's course of studies each semester. The designation Honors in Theatre Studies indicates that the student has been successful in their academic theatre pursuits. We expect that this designation would reflect the high academic achievement expected by the University-Wide Honors Program.
